1. This reports an Air Force proposal to dispose of the Atlas "D" missile complex in the vicinity of Omaha, Nebraska. Three sites, each of which supported three Atlas "D" missiles, are involved; they are:

- 2. These sites, which were acquired by the Air Force in 1958 and 1959, are excess as a result of the phaseout of the Atlas "D" missile which has become obsolete as an Air Force weapons system.
- 3. Site No. 1 was acquired by transfer from the Department of the Army and the Department of the Army has indicated a requirement for a 53-acre portion of the area which was used by the Air Force as an administrative area and is not an integral part of the missile site itself. This 53-acre area of former Army land, part of which is now permitted to

the Army, will be transferred back to the Army. Improvements on it consist of several maintenance buildings, 17 single-family houses and other miscellaneous facilities.

- 4. Each of the three excess missile sites is improved with three missile launch and service buildings, a launch operations building and other miscellaneous improvements.
- 5. The disposal of these three sites has been screened with the Departments of the Army and Navy, both of which, with the exception of the Army requirement for a portion of Site 1, have indicated no requirement for them.
- 6. The disposal of these sites and this report have been approved by the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Installations and Logistics).
